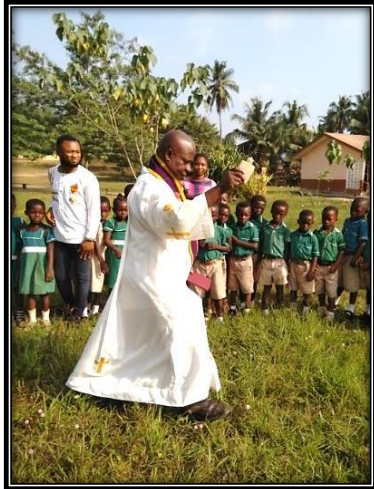




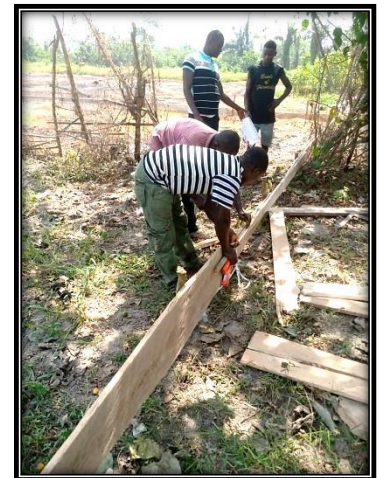
COMING HOME TO OUR HOLY REDEEMER NURSERY SCHOOL (IN GHANA)



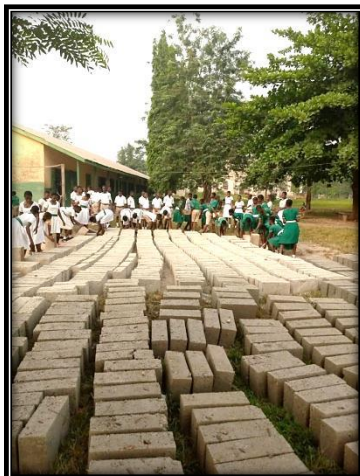
SPRINKLING OF HOLY WATER

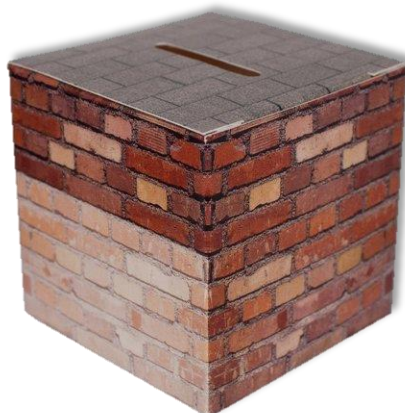
