

Church and State USA + Church and State Mexico (Immigration World Cup)

In 2012, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops took to *Twitter* and established "JusticeForImmigrants" @USCCBJFI in response to the "unprecedented increase in the number of unaccompanied migrating children arriving to the country, predominantly at the U.S./Mexico border". A recent tweet @USCCBJFI addressed human trafficking in the following way:
