




MISSIONARY DISCIPLE OF THE WEEK

**ST. ANSELM, BISHOP, DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH
FEAST DAY: FRIDAY, 21 APRIL**

St. Anselm was born in 1033 in Piedmont. At 15, he wanted to enter the monastery, but was refused by the Abbott because it would displease Anselm's father. The unfortunate outcome of this stonewalling was that he became less religious and adopted a wordly life for a time, after which he came to constantly repent of for the rest of his life. A few years later, while studying in Burgundy, France, he was drawn to an abbot, named LanFranc, in the city of Bec in Normandy. This time he entered the monastery and became a disciple of this rather famous monk. After three years, when LanFranc became abbot of Bec, Anselm was elected



to Prior. St. Anselm's qualities were gentleness and patience—even at a young age, he won over many with these qualities. St. Anselm was an extremely learned theologian like none since the days of St. Augustine. He was profoundly gifted in metaphysics (*the science of transcending what is physical or natural*). It was in this area of theology, St. Anselm wrote two books,

Monologion and *Proslogion*.

In 1078, St. Anselm was chosen as the next abbot of Bec. Because this position involved trips to England, in 1092, during a visit to England, King Rufus, who was gravely ill, decided, in his humble and sick state, to appoint St. Anselm to be the next Archbishop of Canterbury. Over the course of many years with two different monarchs, St. Anselm was constantly besieged with conflict, challenges, and difficulties created by King Rufus and later King Henry I. It was during King Henry's rule, though, that an agreement was created between Henry and Anselm whereby Henry made a pact to renounce the right to collect monies from Bishops. The relationship improved so much, that King Henry left St. Anselm in charge during his absence from Normandy. By this time, his health very poor, as he was an old man. A year later in 1108, he died.
