MISSIONARY DISCIPLE OF THE WEEK

SAINT JOHN CAPISTRANO, PRIEST FEAST DAY: 23 OCTOBER

Saint John Capistrano was born in 1386 in Perugia, Italy. As a boy, he was noticeably bright, and chose to study law. In 1412, he was made governor of Perugia, and married the daughter from a notable family. During some hostilities between Perugia and another city, Saint John was imprisoned, and it was there that he experienced a great change towards a deeply religious life. It is not clear how he became free of his marriage situation, but he did something rather unusual. He rode about town with a huge paper hat that listed all his worst sins. He did this as a form of penance and renouncement of his former sinful ways. He was pelted with dirt by children and in this state asked for permission to join the Friars Minor (a Franciscan order). He was 30 years old. In 1420, Saint John became a priest, and was very assiduous in his studies in Theology. He lived an extremely austere life and was seen often barefoot as he went about preaching and converting souls. Soon he was working with another Franciscan saint, Saint Bernadino of Siena, assisting in the reorganizing of the Franciscan Order after the death of Saint Francis of Assisi. He also assisted the Franciscan nuns, led by the very devout and religious Saint Colette. It was also around this time that he was asked by Pope Nicholas V, to assist in stopping the spread of heresy against the Catholic Church. He was actually an inquisitor sent along with 12 other Franciscans to the area that is now Hungary. These efforts were halted upon the arrival of the Turks who took over the city of Constantinople. Thanks to Saint John's tireless campaign to go out and preach and exhort (strongly encourage) the Hungarian people to form an army and push out the Turks. They were so inspired by his prayers and preaching that they did successfully gain victory of the Turks and for a while, western Europe was saved. Unfortunately, Saint John contracted an infection in the aftermath of the war, and 2 months later died on 23 October 1456. He was canonized in 1724.
