

### MISSIONARY DISCIPLE OF THE WEEK

**SAINT SILVESTER GOZZOLINI, ABBOT, RELIGIOUS FOUNDER  
FEAST DAY: 26 NOVEMBER**

Saint Silvester Gozzolini was born in 1177 in Northern Italy. When he reached adulthood, he thought he wanted to study law as his profession, but quickly this changed to desire for studying theology and the Holy Scriptures. This angered Saint Silvester’s father so much that the father would not speak to him for ten years. He was very fervent in his love and devotion to God and it even got him into trouble with the Bishop because of his zealotry. The Bishop wanted to banish him to a more secluded and contemplative life - which was very appealing to Saint Silvester.



At age 50, he moved from the comforts of his rich church appointment, and retired to live an extremely penitential and austere life as a monk. Others followed and joined him and they became his disciples, so he founded a monastery observing an extremely strict rule of the Benedictine Order. It so embraced poverty, discipline, and strictness that it was separate and apart from the other Benedictine congregations and ultimately they became the Silvestrine Benedictines. Saint Silvester led this Order for 36 years with great wisdom and holiness. He died in 1267 at age 90. By that time, there were eleven monasteries that he founded or reformed in the same strict tradition. There were many miracles at the site of his tomb and in 1598 Pope Clement VIII ordered the name of Saint Silvester Gozzolini to be added to the Roman Martyrology and Pope Leo XIII ordered his Feast Day to be 26 November.
