MISSIONARY DISCIPLE OF THE WEEK ST. FLORA OF BEAULIEU, VIRGIN

Little is known about this young nun, but what is known about her is quite beautiful and remarkable. As a child, it appears she was always turned towards God. She even resisted her parents attempts to arrange a marriage for her. In 1324, she entered the Order of St. John of Jerusalem as a “Hospitaliers” nun—nuns devoted to the care of the sick.



It is said that she was overwhelmed by every kind of spiritual trial so much so, that she experienced intense depression. She was able at times to meet with visiting priests in their role as confessors to help her understand what was happening to her. In all that occurred, it was clear that she was growing nearer to God. It is alleged, that one year, on All Saints Day, she fell into an ecstasy which lasted for three weeks; up to St. Cecilia’s day. She took no food or drink during this time. She was also from time to time given the gift of prophecy – foreknowledge of things that were to happen. She died young, at the age of 38, in 1347, and it has been told that many miracles occurred at her tomb.
