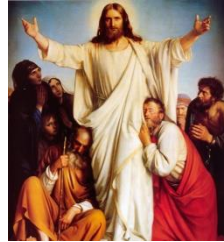

Missionary Disciple of the Week:

**ST. BERTILLE, RELIGIOUS,
MEMORIAL: 06 NOVEMBER**



St. Bertille was born in Soissons, France. In the year 630, at a young age, she became a nun. Because of her great virtue and devotion, she was given great responsibility early on in her vocation and, was chosen for the position of Prioress (someone who assists the Abbess. An Abbess is the head of a women's religious order). Her holy example influenced many in her community in that region of France. In 646, her perfect devotion and holiness lead her to become the first Abbess of Chelles (a monastery in that city). Two Queens, the Queen of East Angles, who had been the wife of King Annas, and Queen Bathildis, who was the wife of Clovis II, ultimately became nuns in this monastery due to the influence of St. Bertille, whose sanctity and good discipline attracted these two women of royalty. St. Bertille governed the monastery as Abbess for 46 years, and died a happy death in 692.
